- First time 1882, 46th anniversary in 2015
- Bi-annual event
- 300-500 participants, record 700 in 2011
- Three day event
- Social program
- Lectures, workshops
- Exhibition
- Library visits



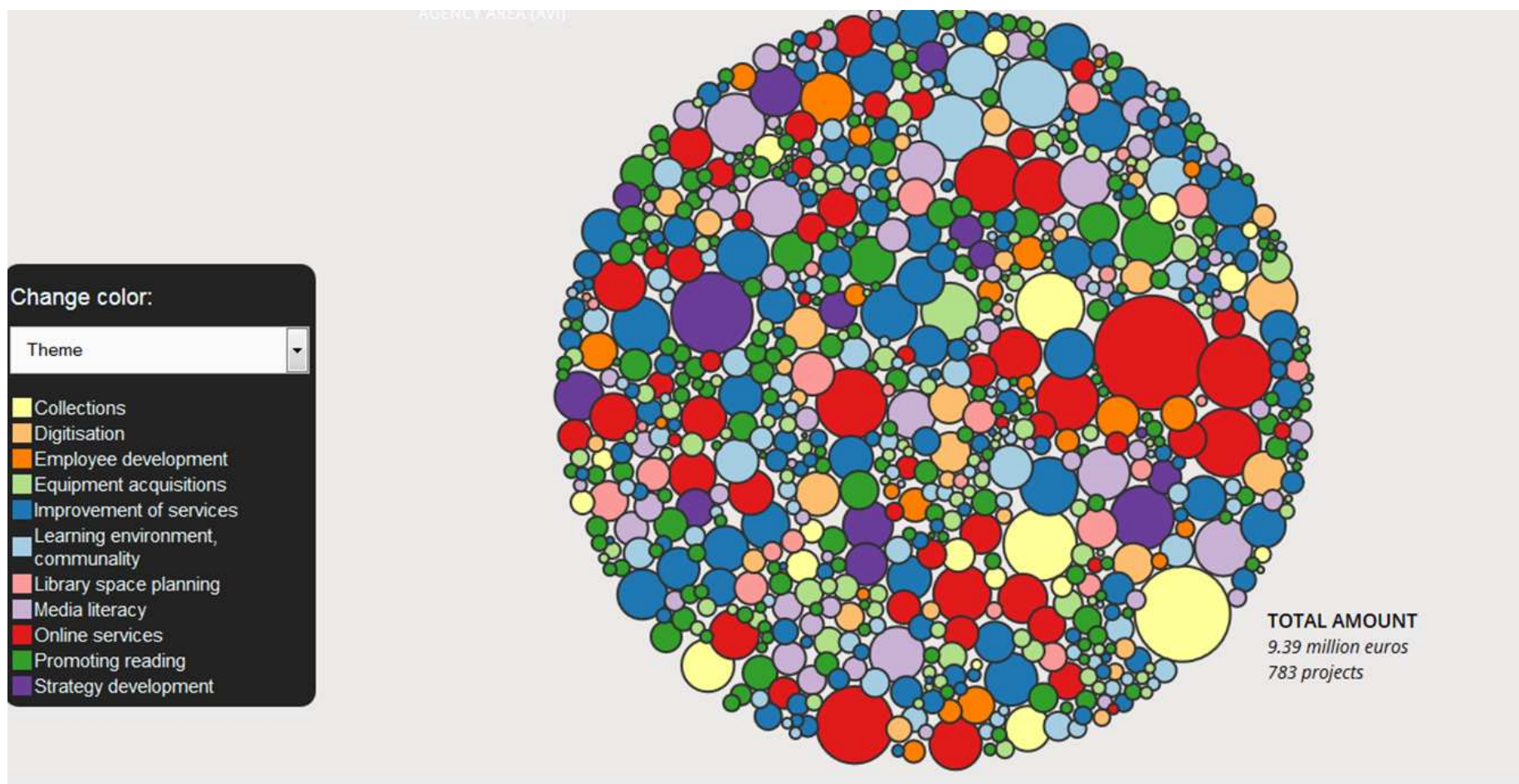




Finnish libraries today

- 10 visits/17 loans/year/inhabitant
- 53 million digital visits
- These numbers going slowly down
- Number of events going up 20 %
- 70 % of respondents : libraries improve their lives
- Library strategies
- Library Acts since 1928
- IFLA Presidential Theme: Strong Libraries, Strong Societies
- Need for strong change in libraries from traditional lending to communality and activating citizens

The Lyon Declaration on Access to Information and Development

- The United Nations is working on its post-2015 development framework
- IFLA and its partners aim to influence the UN development goals through the Lyon Declaration
- Access to information and knowledge is crucial to sustainable development and democratic societies
- IFLA asks library associations, libraries and other organisations to sign and translate the Lyon Declaration and promote it nationally
